

#### 4-2-5: PROHIBITED ACTS AND CONDITIONS:

It shall be unlawful:

A. Open Burning: To cause or allow the open burning of refuse, landscape waste and/or recyclable material...

#### Definitions:

LANDSCAPE WASTE: Shall have the same meaning as "compostible material" as defined elsewhere in this Section.

COMPOSTIBLE MATERIAL: Accumulations of leaves, grass clippings, garden debris, brush, tree clippings and other plant material accumulated as the result of the maintenance of lawns, shrubbery, vines and trees.

Fine Schedule: Burning of refuse, landscape waste material or recyclable material (4-2-5) - \$ 50.00

#### 1-3-2: DEFINITIONS, GENERAL:

NUISANCE: Anything offensive to the sensibilities of reasonable persons, or any act or activity creating a hazard which threatens the health and welfare of inhabitants of the village; or any activity which by its perpetuation can reasonably be said to have a detrimental effect on the property of a person or persons within the community.

#### 4-1-1: NUISANCE DEFINED AND PROHIBITED:

The following acts, conduct and conditions are hereby declared and defined to be nuisances, and when committed, performed and/or permitted to exist by any person within the territorial limits of the Village, are hereby declared to be unlawful and prohibited:

Common Law Nuisances: Any act or offense which is a nuisance according to the common law of the State of Illinois, or declared or defined to be a nuisance by the ordinances of the Village or of the statutes of the State of Illinois. In addition, the officials of the Municipality shall be authorized to abate any nuisance which, while not specifically defined within this Chapter, shall constitute the unreasonable, unwarrantable or unlawful use by a person or property, real or personal, or from his own improper, indecent or unlawful personal conduct which works in obstruction or injury to a right of another or of the public and produces such material annoyance, inconvenience, discomfort or hurt that the law will presume an actionable nuisance. Nuisances may be abated which are public or which are both public and private in nature.

#### B. General Conditions:

Any thing, act, occupation or use of property, premises, equipment or structure adversely affecting the health, welfare and safety of individuals or of the public.

Fine Schedule: Any nuisance violation as defined by this code (4-1-1) - \$ 30.00
